Agriculture

A smaller section of the vegetable plot was then assigned to each student in the year 9/10 class to grow their own vegetables. After digging in a trailer load of manure, generously donated from the Kowald farm, the students planted a variety of vegetables. The radishes are almost ready for harvesting and the students are keen to sample their produce.

It has been exciting to see the vegetable plot come together so quickly and look so amazing. The vegetable plot promises to continue to be a good resource for the newly introduced Agriculture program in the years to come.

Thanks Mr Hicks for taking the initiative to get this program underway and all those involved in making it happen.

Year 5 - 6

The term is moving along quickly and the students have been busy working and learning about many new topics this term. Here are some of them; In Geography the focus has been on natural disasters in particular bushfires and floods. The students looked at the conditions that caused these events by looking at some major ones that have occurred in our country.

In Science, the students have looked at what events can change the shape of the earth's surface. Here the focus has been on earthquakes, tsunamis and volcanoes. They have looked at how these major events and what changes have occurred in various places on our planet. The way they are measured and recorded will also be investigated.

Athletics is a big part of their PE this term and training, refining and improving their efforts in these events is now an important part, as they will be involved both in the Hills Athletics carnival and in our sports day at the end of the term. Students have selected what events they want to try out for to represent our school at the Hills Carnival in two weeks' time.
