### **Snake Catchers Adelaide**

On Tuesday 7th February, Dean from Snake Catchers Adelaide came to talk to the students about snake awareness.

Students were able to get up close and personal with some of the most venomous snakes found in the Adelaide Hills and surrounding areas.

Students were amazed to find out that a brown snake is not necessarily brown and that a red bellied black snake could be brown in colour.

We saw how first aid is applied to a snake bite (thanks to the willingness of Tabitha Cummins)

We also learned that aggressive brown snakes do not attack humans intentionally, but do become aggressive when there is sudden movement nearby.
