



















Science Alive Exursion

Our Year nine and ten students attended the Science Alive STEM Day Out for schools at the Adelaide showgrounds in week two. Students participated in science-based activities, learned about science careers and observed a range of intriguing phenomena (including ducks being made out of fairy floss).

Science and Engineering Challenge

There were eight challenges in all, and each student group was to engage in two challenges during the course of the day; the only exception being the bridge building group who had all day to work on their challenge. Frequent comments from observers and volunteers managing the events went like this: "They're doing very well", "They were the first ones to finish, and the first ones to test," "How old are your students?", "They are doing better than them (St Peter's boyswho looked as if they knew what they were doing)", "Country kids have an advantage over the city kids (this to explain why our students were doing so well in spite of their younger age)".

Well, as you know, our students were so successful at all the challenges that they ended up winning the day! The highlight to end the day was the final bridge testing where our team won by building the only bridge to carried 5kg, and this was followed quickly by the reading out of the final scores. Imagine our amazement and delight as they read out the scores from bottom to top. When they got to the final three we thought, we're in the top three. Then the final two and we knew we were in the top two. Then, a huge roar from the Mount Torrens Christian School students when the second place was read out (St Peter's Boys). I'm afraid this was not to congratulate those boys for coming second, but because we knew we had first place!
