The 'Steam Ranger' otherwise known as the 'Cockle Train'

Last week, the grade 5/6 class had a day on the Cockle Train between Goolwa and Victor Harbour, The class has been studying the novel, The Railway Children, by E. Nesbitt, which revolves around the lives of three children who live near the railway during the days of the old steam locomotive.

It was a perfect day as we embarked on the old style carriage. Inside the lovely wooden carriages, the windows opened upward to allow the breeze and helped passengers to make the most of the lovely ocean views. Beautifully shaped and crafted brass fittings and fixtures added to the refinement of the whole interior. It all combined to provide a most special and enjoyable journey to Victor Harbour.

The contrast on the return journey when we had to travel back to Goolwa in the old 'Red Hens' was surprising. The engine and carriage were amalgamated into one, causing the smell of diesel to permeate the carriage and providing a slightly less pleasant journey. These carriages too though have become part of railway history and so provided an interesting demonstration of the evolution of train travel in South Australia.

The final icing on the cake for the day was our lunch stop on the Goolwa Warf where we had the privilege of seeing close up the arrival and docking of the OSCAR W Steam Boat. Here we had the opportunity go on board and explore the vessel. This is one of the few steam boats still operating with a genuine steam engine. We were able to inspect the brightly painted engine, see the piles of wood in the hold and examine all the beautiful old fixtures and fittings of a live and functioning Steam river boat.
