From the Principal

This last term of the year again promises to be a busy, but fun time for students with a significant number of events and excursions. The Oscar W Steam Boat Excursion


It seems like much longer ago than just last week, but it was just last Thursday, when the whole senior school took some time out of their studies to take a trip on a steam boat down to the mouth of the Murray River. It proved a welcome and much needed change of scenery for the year 11 and 12 students in particular, who have been 'under the pump' to complete the assessment requirements of the SACE board.

The paddle steamer Oscar W was moored at the Goolwa wharf, waiting with engine steaming for our arrival. Today we would see a true relic of the Industrial Age in pristine working order as it was put to work doing what it was built to do, plying up and down the Murray River. The paddle boat was built in 1908, and in the past worked to bring wool bales from the interior up as far as Renmark, down to Victor Harbour and eventually to Europe. It played a significant role in putting Australia on the map, and establishing our economy. It was restored in 1988 and is now maintained as a working exhibit at Goolwa.

The day was a bit on the cool side, but that didn't stop us from being fascinated to see the steam engine in action, pistons and all. We soon discovered the warmest place to stand was near the vents where the warm air from the engine room blew out. We first travelled from the wharf down to the Goolwa Barrages, before turning around and going up river, under the Hindmarsh Island Bridge and up as far as the mouth to Currency Creek. By the time we had turned around and docked again, two hours had gone by, and we were ready to enjoy hot chips and chicken nuggets on the lawns beside the wharf. Timotei had the foresight to bring his fishing rod and there was just enough time to mess about trying to catch some of the carp we could see mouthing up at the surface, before heading home (but without a catch).
